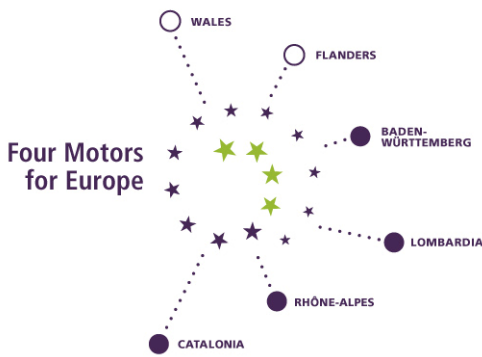

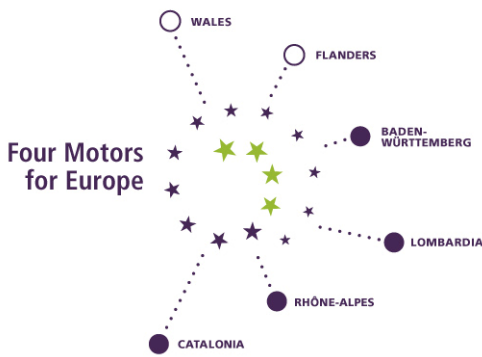

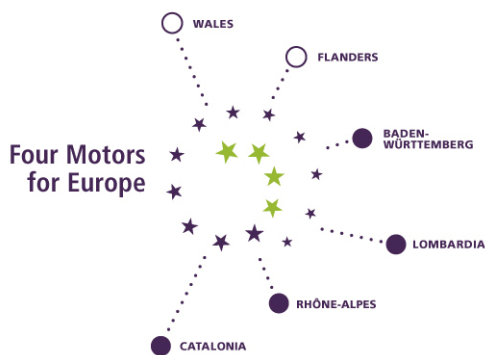

ê Who are the “Four Motors for Europe”?

¶ A unique cooperative venture

The "Four Motors for Europe" are four major European Regions: Baden-Württemberg (Germany), Catalunya (Spain), Lombardy (Italy) and Rhône-Alpes (France).

They joined together in 1988 to undertake an original form of cooperation as the "Four Motors for Europe". Sharing no common borders, these leading Regions in their respective countries, share many common features (economic power, expertise, research potential, tourist appeal, renowned Schools and Universities, etc.) and a desire to undertake innovative actions together. They work together to develop cooperation, notably in the areas of economy, research, higher education, culture, vocational training and sports.

Thus, the joint actions undertaken by the "Four Motors for Europe" Regions contribute to their renown, making them more attractive and participating in the construction of a Europe that is ever closer to its citizens.

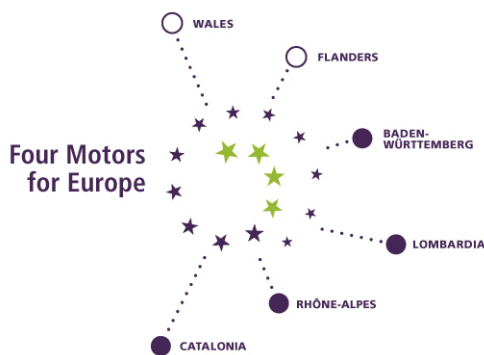
¶ History and organization

On 9 September, 1988, the "Four Motors for Europe" Regions signed a cooperation agreement in view of the Single European Market that was to begin on 1 January, 1993.

They had a twofold objective: **to contribute to the internationalization** of the regions and their citizens, and **to promote the role of their Regions in Europe** at the heart of European construction.

The absence of common borders and permanent bureaucratic structures made the "Four Motors" a flexible alliance and a unique decentralized cooperation which has managed to perpetuate its actions and consolidate the links uniting the four Regions. Cooperation among the “Four Motors for Europe” operates according to the principle of institutional flexibility. The partners have chosen to have a rotating presidency, generally for a one-year term. One of the "Four Motors" Regions holds the rotating Presidency of the association.

As they run joint actions in a wide range of files, some others partners work with the “Four Motors for Europe” as associated Regions, such as Flanders (Belgium), Wales (United Kingdom) or Malopolska (Poland).



¶ Joint actions

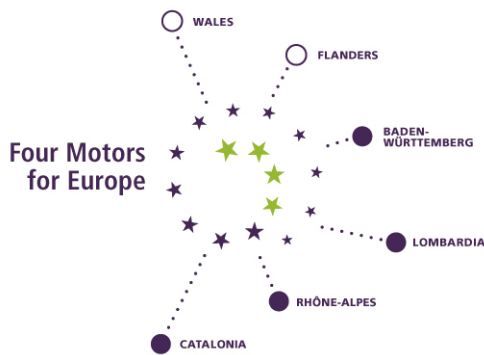
A Coordinating Committee meets regularly (approximately 3 times a year) under the supervision of the presiding Region. It implements and coordinates joint actions, impelled by the political impetus set by the Presidents of the Regions with each new presidency.

Depending on priorities, thematic working groups (“Economy”, “Sports and Youth”, “Higher Education and Research”, “Agriculture”, “Environment”, “Culture”, etc.) develop and undertake joint projects.

The partnership is also based on the idea of flexibility. During the meeting on 17 November, 2004, in Brussels (start of the Catalunya presidency), the Presidents renewed their collaboration within the “Four Motors for Europe” based on the principles of flexibility and variable geography. This new outlook thus encourages occasional cooperation with other European Regions as well as bilateral or trilateral actions.

Here are a few concrete examples of actions developed by the "Four Motors for Europe":

- **Cultural exchanges:** cooperation in cinematographic productions between Rhône-Alpes and Baden-Württemberg, artist residences and theatrical cooperation;
- **Cooperation between universities:** A joint “Four Motors for Europe” Master Degree (in the project stage) and European research projects;
- **European projects for the environment:** the "Four Motors" Regions, in an alliance with other European regions, have responded to a call for projects by the European Commission concerning environmental innovation;
- **University and high-school student exchanges;**
- Exchanges in the area of vocational training (“Leonardo” projects);
- A project concerning **lifelong orientation**, the “DROA” project.



ê The “Four Motors for Europe” in India, the best of European environmental expertise

"Four Motors for Europe", all leading Regions in their respective countries, share many common features (economic power, expertise in leading-edge sectors, research potential, renowned Schools and Universities, tourist appeal) and strong environmental ambitions.

¶ The “Four Motors for Europe” Worldwide

The “Four Motors for Europe” partners organize **joint economic promotion missions**, both within the European Union and outside its borders. For example, they went together in Prague, in Morocco and to China in 2006 to the Bio Forum in Shanghai.

They run joint actions as regards the international mobility of students and researchers assert their positions on large-scale European topics and organise operations to promote their companies on foreign markets.

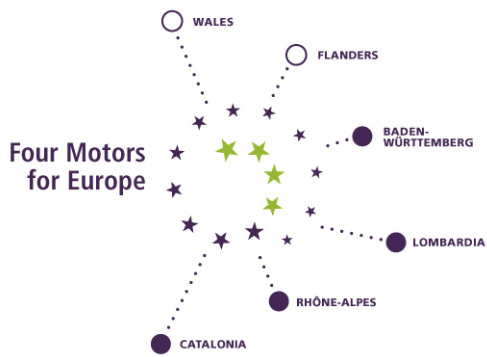
In India, the “Four Motors for Europe” and associated partners, Flanders (Belgium) and Wales(United Kingdom), will take part in the “FICCI Environment Conclave” (Federation of Indian Chambers of Commerce and Industry) in New Delhi, the 20 & 21st of February 2007, as a joint delegation of senior government officials, experts and environmental companies.

¶ Aims of the FICCI Environment Conclave in New Delhi

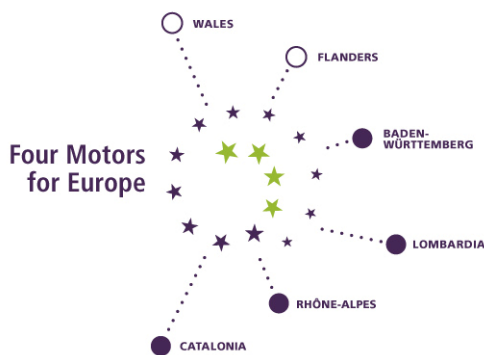
- 1/ Institutional promotion of the six Regions in the conglomerate, with high level political meetings between European regional executives and Indian ministers.
- 2/ Promotion of the environmental sector and European technologies.
- 3/ B2B contacts between European companies and Indian partners.

¶ A joint mission to promote

The "Four Motors for Europe" and associated partners, are conducting a special mission in India, devoted to the eco-environmental sector and the promotion of European technologies.



During the “FICCI Environment Conclave”, companies, experts and political decision-makers from the "Four Motors for Europe" and its associated regions will present themselves to the Indian market. In continuity with the previous missions to Prague (organized by Lombardia) and to Morocco (organized by Catalonia), the environmental sector has been singled out because it represents a real opportunity for promoting European technologies on the Indian market.



ê Rhône-Alpes, the Presiding Region for 2006

One of the "Four Motors" Regions holds the rotating Presidency of the association. Rhône-Alpes holds the one-year Presidency for 2006-2007.

¶ Meeting of the Presidents in Rabat, January 2006

The last transfer of the presidency of the "Four Motors", from Catalunya to Rhône-Alpes, took place in Rabat, Morocco, on 16 January, 2006. This meeting in Morocco was the first time the Presidents had met outside the European Union, and materialized the third major principle agreed upon by the Presidents in November 2004, which consists in concentrating their joint international action on an extracommunity zone proposed by each presidency.

In response to the Catalan presidency's proposal to take part in the Euro-Mediterranean process on the sub-state level, the four partners wanted to jointly demonstrate their desire for further cooperation with the regions and countries in the Mediterranean basin based on two central themes: sustainable development and environmental technologies.

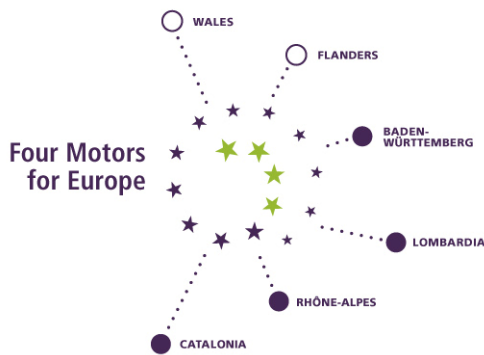
As the first experience of this kind, the "Four Motors" mission was to promote debate, share good practices and develop economic relations among the regions in question through the presence of political representatives from the four Regions and the associate Regions of Flanders and Wales, experts specialized in sustainable development and business leaders working in this field.

¶ Major events during the 2006 Rhône-Alpes presidency

- 28-29 September, 2006: Interregional Meetings on "Regions and Cultural Diversity: European and Worldwide Dynamics", Lyon, Palais des Congrès

In the current context marked by the ongoing globalization phenomenon, culture is a factor for resistance against the risks of uniformization. In this field today, regions are a framework for original projects and fruitful dialogue.

Cultural diversity has thus been recognized by UNESCO as a fundamental value and the International Convention adopted in October 2005, concerning the "preservation and promotion of cultural diversity", is currently being submitted for ratification by the Member States. The regions of the world must serve as actors and relays for this concept.



That is why the Rhône-Alpes Region decided to bring together artists, researchers, culture professionals, political, economic and social actors and representatives of civil society during its 2006 presidency of the "Four Motors for Europe" to share their experiences and to formulate concrete projects.

- 9-13 October, 2006: Global Conference “Clusters 2006 – Lyon-Rhône-Alpes”, 9th conference of “The Competitiveness Institute” (TCI), Lyon, Palais des Congrès

This annual global event focusing on policies for “clusters” and competitiveness centers is being organized in Lyon this year. The “Four Motors for Europe” will play a special role in the political inauguration of the conference and through the joint workshops for discussions on clusters.

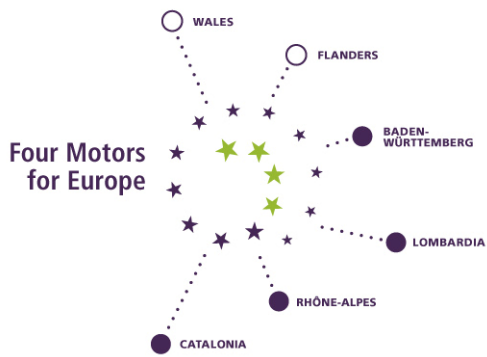
- 9-12 October, 2006: “Open Days – European Week of Regions and Cities”, Brussels

Open Days 2006, co-organized by the Committee of the Regions and the European Commission, will be the most important event of the year for European local authorities. That is why the Rhône-Alpes Region has decided to take an active part in this event by heading a group of Regions brought together around the “Four Motors for Europe” (Baden-Württemberg, Catalunya, Lombardy and Rhône-Alpes, as well as Swiss Cantons, Malopolska in Poland, and Piedmont and Aosta Valley in Italy).

In a context in which competitiveness and sustainable development are indispensable to preserving the lifestyle of Europe’s citizens, this partnership has decided to organize two workshops on the following topics: research & innovation and eco-technologies & renewable energy sources. They will be an opportunity for Europeans to join in discussions and to share their best practices so that the regions can become the principal actor in sustainable economic development.

- February 2007: Economic promotion and joint policy mission, New Delhi, India

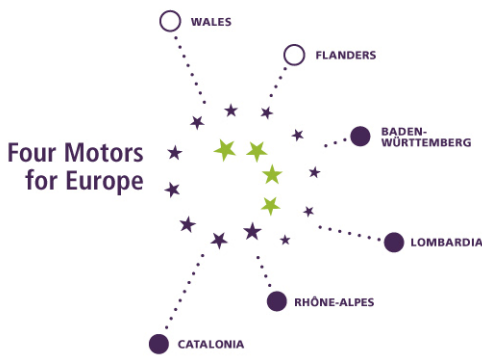
